2. Using email or other means of corresponding, write to another person (friend or parent) about the book that you have read. Write at least 10 sentences to describe this book, the events, and the characters.
3. Using a character from a book you have read, create a Venn Diagram that compares and contrasts one character from the book to someone in your life.
4. After reading a book, write your own test. The test may be a combination of matching, multiple choice, multiselect items, short answer, and essay questions. Please have at least 10 questions on your test and an answer key.
5. Create a Top Ten List in which you write and illustrate events or ideas you have learned from the book.
